

NJPMA: IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION for ATTENDEES

The Basic Pesticide Training Class is required for all those wishing to become either Certified Pesticide Applicators or Pesticide Operators (those who work under the supervision of a Certified Pesticide Applicator). This class is REQUIRED training for taking the DEP Core Exam and for all Operator's Licenses, in addition to meeting all category specific requirements.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- **How do I register?**
 - PLEASE register for classes IN ADVANCE THROUGH ONLINE REGISTRATION OR EMAILING US. Classes often fill up a week ahead of time, so don't wait until the last minute.
 - To see if a class is full right away, click on ONLINE REGISTRATION....if it doesn't allow you to register, the class is full or closed due to weather.
- **Why do you need my email?**
 - **Confirmations:** Confirmations of registration are sent by email.
 - **Cancellations:** Classes may be cancelled or rescheduled due to lack of attendance or bad weather. We will notify all registrants by email.
- **How do I receive confirmation that I'm registered?**
 - If you register online, you will receive confirmation automatically
 - If you register by mail or fax, you will receive an EMAIL about a week before your class
- **How much is the class?**
 - All BPT classes are \$99 (unless you are an NJPMA member)
- **How do I pay for class?**
 - You must either send payment in advance or bring it to class in the form of a check made out to NJPMA or email us your credit card information before class.
- **How long is the class?**
 - Classes run from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm, EXCEPT for those in Union County, which run from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm.
- **What time should I arrive?**
 - Please plan to arrive early in case of traffic or bad weather....certificates cannot be issued if you are late to class.
- **How do I get my license?**
 - Getting your pesticide license is similar to getting a driver's license: First you get the training from an accredited source (NJPMA), second you schedule your exam (NJDEP), and THEN you get your license. At the end of your class, you will receive a certificate: You should make a copy for your records, then send the certificate to the NJDEP after you contact NJDEP, not NJPMA, to schedule your exam OR FOR ANY LICENSING RELATED QUESTIONS at <http://www.state.nj.us/dep/enforcement/pcp/> or 609-984-6614.
